On the evening of September 24, the Ridgewood School Board of Trustees will host its annual fall dinner recognizing its 2022 Distinguished Alumni and Honorary Alumni, and members of its anniversary classes (Classes of 1997, 1992, 1987, 1982, 1972, 1952, and 1947).

The Board hopes you will help it celebrate this notable group! The honorees represent what is best about Ridgewood. Their lives embody the values that we strive to develop in your children. Your presence will offer proof to alumni attending that Ridgewood School continues as a strong community that values excellence in education. It will be an enjoyable and inspiring evening for all of us!

Recipients of the 2022 Distinguished Alumni Award include Cynthia Durfey Smith '47 who is being recognized as an artist and for her support of Ridgewood School and the Springfield community. During the 1950–1960s Ms. Smith was an active supporter of the abstract expressionist art movement in New York City.

Also being recognized as a distinguished alumni is the Rev. Eric N. Lindblade, Jr. '67, a Methodist minister. In addition to serving as a minster, Rev. Lindblade chaired the North Carolina Conference on Christian Unity, was secretary of the North Carolina Conference Council on Ministries, and a board member of Richmond County Habitat for Humanity. He is the son of former Ridgewood Headmaster Rev. Eric Lindblade and his wife Helene Belger Lindblade who taught science at Ridgewood.

The third alumni being recognized is the Rev. Dr. Angelique Walker-Smith

who was one of Ridgewood's first African American graduates. Rev. Dr. Walker-Smith credits Ridgewood for the educational foundation that prepared her for her degrees at Kent State University, Yale University Divinity School, and Princeton Theological Seminary. She is a senior associate for Pan African and Orthodox Church Engagement at Bread for the World and was elected president of the Historic Black Church Family of Christian Churches Together.

Phillip R. Trimble '49 is the fourth alumni who will be recognized as a distinguished alumni. He is a former U. S. Ambassador to Nepal, law professor, and mountaineer who led the U. S. expedition to Mt. Everest in 1976.

During the dinner, the Board of Trustees will also confer the status of Honorary Alumni on three individuals who have served Ridgewood School with distinction by making significant contributions of time, effort, or resources to the school's welfare, reputation, or prestige and by serving as role models for Ridgewood's students. This honor is being awarded to Deanna Brougher, Mary Lou Loftis, and Mel Marsh.

Spring Semester Student Council Report

This spring, Student Council members brought back old traditions and started new ones. Under the leadership of Student Council President Mahed Rizvi our students raised money for local charities, volunteered, and hosted events at school.

During the spring, the Student Council brought back two traditions, Ties and Tiaras in March and Gals and

Gamers in April. Ties and Tiaras was a formal dance with food, music, and a dance competition with all proceeds going to the Fatherhood Initiative (\$415 donation). Gals and Gamers included video game tournaments, board games, contests, a special visit from Mario and fundraising for Safe Harbor (\$225). Mary Cunningham, who led the two projects, worked with students in the 5th and 6th grades to ensure that the events will continue in the future.

Over the first five months of 2022, students collected and delivered various donations to local nursing homes and charities including 325 homemade valentines, over 100 hand-painted Easter baskets, treat bags, board games, and cards. Students also collected board games for Project Woman, coats/hats/gloves/ books for Rocking Horse Center, paper products for IHN Homeless Shelter, as well as made blankets for the C.A.R.E. House, and baked cookies for nurses and doctors at the hospital.

Sixteen upper-level students volunteered over 100 hours during the annual Service Day in February. Students filled boxes and distributed items to families and individuals at the Food Bank. Groups made hope bags and organized donations at Project Woman. They also helped organize and move

During Spirit Week in March, the Student Council hosted a wide variety of school events including Pi Day, skating at the Chiller, gym games, and themed days.

The students took over the Zero Waste Store at the Hatch downtown starting in April. The store, which is open on the first Friday of each month, sells items that help the community "reduce, reuse, and recycle." Proceeds go to the charities of the month and to purchase new items for the store. The store has already helped

ISACS is the Independent School Association of the Central States. It is an organization that provides external validation of school quality. Its accreditation assures that a school is operating at the highest level possible. Its accreditation process validates that the school has met more than fifty standards of best practice for independent education; confirms that the school subscribes to principles of good



practice in admissions and employment; and attests that the school has a fully developed

and disclosed mission and philosophy of education and that its programs are in congruence with that mission and philosophy.

Ridgewood School is one of only 42 independent schools in Ohio to have earned ISACS accreditation. *****

Ridgewood Student Council Receives Project Woman's Purple Ribbon!



Ridgewood students, staff, trustees, and friends joined members of the Springfield community on April 27, 2022, in the Courtyard by Marriott ballroom when Ridgewood's Student Council was presented Project Woman's Purple Ribbon Award. This award is presented to a group or individual for significant volunteerism that helps Project Woman achieve its mission of providing services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. In addition to the Purple Ribbon Award, the Student Council received an Ohio House of Representatives Commendation for serving our community.

When presented the Purple Ribbon Award, Dan Metzger, Ridgewood teacher and Student Council Advisor, credited the students for annually finding new ways to support Project Woman. He reported that, although the student council is led by 7th and 8th graders, it inspires younger Ridgewood students to join its efforts. Student Council President Mahed Rizvi shared that in addition

New Campus Feature!






