

The 2021 Graduates Reflect on Their Ridgewood Education

A week before graduation, I asked the eighth graders to reflect on and write about their Ridgewood experiences and the significance of our school in their lives. 

Students also had their first opportunity in over a year to return to the Food Bank where they filled boxes with food for seniors and the homeless.


Ridgewood's history was a labor of love.

Tim, a Ridgewood alumnus, is the grandson of one of Ridgewood's founders, Harry S. Kissell and the son of one of its early alumnae, Mary Lu Kissell Noonan '27 and a former Ridgewood trustee, Howard Noonan. Tim, the writer of institutional histories and memoirs, brought both his skills as an author/historian and his familial love for "The Little School in the Woods," to telling the tale of the school created to serve families in Springfield's upscale neighborhood of "Ridgewood in the Country Club District," an area developed by his grandfather.

Tim's work recounts Ridgewood's first one hundred years and its struggles, growth, diversification, and success. The wonderfully illustrated book places the school within its local and national contexts, introduces board members, headmasters, teachers, and benefactors who were instrumental in seeing that the school survived, grew, changed with the times, and today thrives. ☀️

Angelique Walker-Smith '72



Kent State alumna, Rev. Dr. Walker-Smith completed her Masters Degree at Yale University Divinity School in 1993. In 1995,

she became the first African American woman to graduate from the Doctor of Ministry Program at Princeton Theological Seminary. For nineteen years, Angelique served as the Executive Director of the Church Federation of Greater Indianapolis. In 2014, Angelique became the Senior Associate for Pan African and Orthodox Church Engagement at Bread for the World and moved to Washington, D.C. In 2018, she was elected president of the Historic Black Church Family of Christian Churches Together (CCT). CCT seeks to foster unity among all the major Christian traditions. These traditions are grouped into five families: Historic Black, Catholic, Historic Protestant, Orthodox, and Evangelical-Pentecostal. She is the first female president of any of CCT's five families.

Lela Reichert-Klein '93

With the recent opening of Dayton's Gem City Market, Ms. Reichert-Klein achieved one of her goals as a leader in the Dayton co-op movement. Lela, who earned a BA from Cornell University and her JD from Harvard Law School, returned to Dayton in 2012 and in 2016 co-founded Greater Dayton Union Cooperative Initiative, now Co-op Dayton, a non-profit working to develop a network of cooperatives in the city. As co-executive director of Co-op Dayton, Lela worked tirelessly to make the Gem City Market a reality. A 2018 "Daytonian of the Week," Lela believes that Dayton's future relies on its residents working together for change and not relying on outsiders to develop the city.




Lauren Fish '04
